American Sign Language (ASL) Club will teach kids the basics of ASL in a fun and creative format.

Basketball Club will provide basic instruction, fundamentals of the sport, teamwork, and scrimmages. The kids will learn how to play together and the basic rules of the game.

Bricks 4 Kidz Club will use LEGOs to build simple machines that roll, spin, shoot, and drive. This STEM-driven club will incorporate LEGO Technic bricks, motors, batteries, and more to create fun, theme-driven models.

Crochet Club will teach students to crochet, helping them create a potholder, hat, or blanket depending on their skill level. Students will feel a sense of accomplishment as they work together learning new skills.

Dance Club students will learn and explore the elements of dance and creative movement in a fun and dynamic way. The club will introduce the fundamentals of dance, vocabulary, etiquette, and different styles of dance.

Gaga Ball Club will teach students how to play this fun and fast-paced game and provide individual and team skills.

Guitar Club is a fun introduction to strings by RJ Hernandez. Each student will have access to an individual instrument during club meeting times and explore the foundations of guitar.

Karate Club, facilitated by Dojo's Family Martial Arts, will help kids build their confidence and self-control, boost physical and mental wellness, and learn how to identify and prevent bullying behavior.

Math Club will build conceptual understanding, math fluency, and automatic recall of math facts through fun, interactive activities including an in-house shopping spree and Sylvan's Junior Olympics.

Mock Trial Club introduces students to the foundations and roles of the judicial process through basic trial simulation and legal preparation. It's a great sneak peek into mock trial before middle school clubs.

PE Games Club will give students the opportunity to have fun with their favorite PE games, including freeze tag, capture the flag, jump the river, and other cooperative games.

Rosie Reader & Crafts Club - Join Rosie Reader, Des Moines Public Library's pink, fun-loving, book-reading mascot as she guides us through literacy fun, crafts, and STEM activities, with a leader fluent in Spanish/English.

Soccer Club, led by Des Moines Menace Soccer, will provide basic soccer instruction and scrimmages, offering kids a way to stay active and build bonds with their peers while learning soccer skills.

Spreading Joy Club will focus on creating joy in our local community. Participants will do small acts of kindness such as painting kindness rocks for the school, writing letters to veterans, and making gifts for teachers.

STEAM Club, led by the Science Center of lowa, teaches students about robotics and engineering. Students receive hands-on instruction with robots, learn how they are programmed, and their real-world uses.

Young Chefs Club will teach kids how to make appetizers, quick bites, easy lunches, breakfast for dinner, and desserts.

You will be contacted if an opening becomes available. **Changes/Cancellations:** We are unable to accommodate changes after registration closes. Please be sure your student is available for club meeting dates. A light snack is available.
